MEMORIAL GARDEN GUIDE FOR VISITORS



History of the Lord Stirling Stable Memorial Garden

As you walk down from the parking lot toward the indoor ring, on your left is a row of ornamental crabapple trees next to the fence. The trees were planted by Harry Case, Lord Stirling Stable's first stable manager. Under those trees is the Lord Stirling Stable Memorial Garden, which hosts perennial plants that are mostly native and an assortment of carved stones. Each stone is engraved with the name of a horse, pony, or cat who was part of our LSS community and who has since crossed the rainbow bridge. *Please note: there are no animals buried in the garden!*

Before there was an actual Memorial Garden, there were groupings of memorial stones in a small area in front of the indoor ring viewing room. Before long, that area became crowded. Lawn mowers were causing damage to the stones (and vice-versa), and many of the stones had disappeared from view under the bushes. So the decision was made to create a new garden under the crabapple trees. The stones were moved and, through a Somerset County Park Foundation grant, shade-loving perennials were recommended and purchased by Leonard J. Buck Garden staff and planted by volunteers. Additional perennials were purchased by the Friends of Lord Stirling Stable or donated by individual members.


Most of the stones were carved by Gabriele Cohen, whose work also graces the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in NYC. Gabriele is the daughter-in-law of Betty Cohen, who was a founding member of FLSS. Remaining stones, as noted in the text, came from Graphic Rocks (https://www.graphicrocks.com).

The best time of year to visit the garden is early spring, late-March through April, when the plants are starting to appear but before they fully grow out and obscure the stones. (Mid-winter is probably the best time to view the stones.) The plants in the garden include:

- Brunnera, the first to bloom in the spring, with variegated leaves and tiny blue flowers
- Ligularia, big plants that more or less dominate the garden with their "lily pad" leaves. They bloom with large yellow flowers later in the season.
- Cranesbill geraniums, blooming in late spring through summer with pinkish-purple flowers.
- Astilbe, another spring-summer bloomer, has a soft lovely spike blossom
- Coral bells, with reddish leaves and sprays of tiny flowers that bloom late summer into fall
- Ferns
- Wood poppies, which have bright green "stag horn" leaves and bloom repeatedly with bright yellow flowers
- Violets: white violets, common blue violets, and a sea of wild wood violets that you will see in many of the pictures in this guide.
- Solomon's seal, with green and white striped leaves (similar to hostas) and tiny white pendant blooms underneath the leaves
- Echinacea (purple coneflowers) in various colors, planted to attract butterflies
- Mock strawberries and buttercups treading that line between weeds and wildflowers. The
 mock strawberries put out berries which are edible, but wholly devoid of taste.














